

Amenities and Highways Report

Wellesbourne Sports & Community Centre:

Update –

- All the leylandii trees have now been removed, with quite a few residents collecting the available wood and chippings.
- Further work to tidy the site involving repairs to the post and rail fence, removal of the steel barrier at side of building. Reshaping of remaining chestnut trees, and removal of goal posts on practice pitch, are all awaiting costings.
- The modem and line to connect the CCTV installation is now installed.
- Window contractor's surveyor is attending site on Feb 10th.
- Architect asked to draw an additional plan for the changing rooms incorporating a first floor extension to the existing building. (No additional costs for plans)
- Costings have been received for the supply and installation of shuttering to all windows. (See resolution)
- Quotations to be sought for the installation of electrical power supplies to operate the ground floor shutters, and building work to enlarge one rear wall opening to accommodate an additional door.
- Tender response has now been received for the operation of, and investment in the facility, following our open day and the PC tender document issued to interested parties in November.
- The working party will need to meet as quickly as possible to consider how best to take forward the proposals received.
- The grass cutting contract is currently out to tender, with submissions due for Feb 24th.
- Letter received from the Woodhouse family re village sporting facilities – noted.

Sports Association AGM:

Attended the recent meeting, where the proposed new changing facilities were presented and the plans discussed.

A very positive meeting, where the association also agreed to approach the Football Association to determine if grant funding would be available.

Highways:

River Dene pollution at Bridge Street – the source has been identified by WCC and should be resolved shortly.

All Highway matters reported and discussed at the Amenities and Highways meeting on Jan17th have been actioned.
