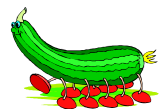

COOKERY GUIDELINES

Preserves (Jams and Jellies)

- Blackberry and Apple is not considered as soft fruit.
- Jars with a threaded top should have a twist top only.
- Jars with a plain rim should have snap tops or wax disc and cellophane top.
- Jars should be filled to the top.
- Jars should not be branded in any way.
- All jars should be dated (day, month and year)

Lemon Curd

- Wax discs should be an exact fit
- Cellophane tops with a rubber band should be used
- All jars should be dated (day, month and year)
